Viiankiaapa













Viiankiaapa is one of the most outstanding aapa mires in the Sodankylä area. A diverse mire nature and a wide range of bird species make Viiankiaapa a fascinating destination year round.

Welcome to the aapa mire!

You can hike the 4,3 kilometres long Viiankiaapa Nature Trail, located at the northern part of Vijankjaapa mire. Most parts of the trail is covered in duckboards. Information boards along the trails describe the wildlife in Viiankiaapa: valuable rich fens and springs, and threatened plant and bird species.

Viiankijärvi campfire hut, on the Viiankiaapa Nature Trail, is a good location for a lunch break. At the start of the trail and at Viiankijärvi campfire hut there are also dry toilets available.

One can visit the southern part of Viiankiaapa on the Viiankiaapa Siurunmaa Nature Trail. The 1,7 km long one-way trail has a nature observation tower and a lean-to shelter in the end of the trail. The duckboards on the trail are in very poor condition.



Nature's rich diversity

More than half of Finland's birds nest at mires. At Viiankiaapa one may spot e.g. willow warbler (Phylloscopus trochilus). brambling (Fringill montifringilla) and meadow pipit (Anthus pratensis).

Waders greenshank (Tringa nebularia) and wood sandpiper (Tringa glareola) are also common in Viiankiaapa. Please admire the birds only from afar - binoculars or telescope are a good idea for birdwatching.

There is a great diversity of plants in Viiankiaapa. In the summertime yellow marsh saxifrage (Saxifraga hirculus) and fairy slipper (Calypso bulbosa) are in bloom. Please note, that it is strictly forbidden to pick or harm the plants.

At Viiankiaava you are in a nature conservation area. Respect the nature in everything you do.

Trail starting point

The Kersilö Nature Trail is located at a 25 km distance from Sodankylä centre. There is a small parking area with space for 3-4 cars.

There are guideposts to Siurunmaa Nature Trail from the Savukoski-Tanhua road.

Hiking and Protecting Nature

- · Respect nature and take other hikers into consideration.

- ·You can pick berries and mushrooms, but not stones or plants. Do not disturb animals.
