

Arctic Circle Hiking Area
























The Arctic Circle Hiking Area offers excellent opportunities for nature lovers to pursue a wide range of outdoor activities. The area is suitable for family hiking trips and it has also accessible trails. The waters in the ares offer great opportunities for fishing, rowing, kayaking and rafting.

The hiking area includes both natural areas and commercial forests of various ages. The finest rapids of the Raudanjoki River crossing the area are Vikaköngäs and Vaattunkiköngäs, and they are

easily reached via suspension bridges. There are lush groves in Könkään- and Kielosaari islands and the rocky hills of Vaattunki-, Könkään- and Sortovaara have hundreds of years old hilltop pine forests. Vianaapa and Kivalonaapa's almost treeless mires stretch untouched. Vianaapa and Korva-aapa are protected areas. At Kivalonaapa mire you can learn about old meadow culture.

The hiking area is located 25 km northeast from Rovaniemi along the Highway 4 (E75). Popular starting points are at Vikaköngäs and Vaattunkiköngäs.

Hiking and protecting

- Respect nature and take other hikers into consideration.
- Make a fire only on designated fireplaces. Open fire is prohibited if the forest fire warning is in effect.
- Hike litter free. There are recycling points at Vikaköngäs and Vaattunkiköngäs, the trails' starting points, but no bins on the trails, carry your rubbish back with you.
- You can pick berries and mushrooms, but not stones or plants. Do not disturb animals.
- Fishing is permitted in Vikaköngäs Recreational Fishing Area if you purchase a Metsähallitus' recreational fishing licence (permit area 2565, www.eraluvat.fi).
- Keep the pets on a leash.
- Bring your own toilet paper.
- Driving motor vehicles outside official roads is prohibited.


